

K of C State Church Award

In the past, State K of C recognized 20 councils in each service program for outstanding participation. The 20 awards consisted of the top 5 from each of the 4 divisions. This year, State recognized only one council for each rather than 20 councils.

We won this prestigious honor. A description, of St. Luke's award follows and was read before the state convention, May 5.



THE STORY: In January 2014, a young man set his own house on fire, crashed through the front doors of our church, vandalized it, set it on fire, and For example, the president of the par-

then committed suicide. It was a tragic event that shook our parish community. Our pastor had just been assigned to our parish a few months earlier. Nonetheless, he took charge of the tragedy with a truly Christian attitude. He reached out with compassion to the young man's family. He arranged for temporary worship space in neighborhood churches. He did whatever he could to keep the parish together.

The Knights of Columbus assisted where possible to maintain unity within the parish. One Brother donated the use of his funeral home chapel for Mass. Brother Knights helped with parking and moving supplies to the location. A few weeks after the fire, the parish hall was transformed into the worship space. This curtailed activities for the Council, but we adapted to the restrictions. The pastor requested the Council to continue parish dances to provide opportunities for fellowship. The dances were held on Friday evenings to accommodate church schedules, with extra support from Knights to setup and restore the space.

In 2016, our parish embarked on a capital campaign to raise money to build a new church. Many Knights served on various committees to solicit funds, work with architect, designers, insurance companies and the builder.

ish council and one of the primary interfaces to the builder was a Knight. The chairman of the finance committee was a Knight. Acoustic requirements came from the music ministry, of which several were Knights. As part of the capital campaign, the Council also contributed \$7,500 to a naming opportunity to provide the cross atop the church. This was over and above what many Brothers already contributed individually.

Finally, on October 21, 2017, the newly appointed Bishop Luis Raphael Zarama celebrated the Dedication Mass for the new church. The Knights provided an honor guard. They helped with hospitality ministry and parking. They set up the parish hall for a reception and cleaned up afterwards.

Through the tragedy and the aftermath, the parish proved that with God's help, we can overcome any challenges. The Knights of Columbus Council demonstrated that its Brothers are integral in the fabric of the parish, and that through prayer, personal sacrifice, and financial support, we can achieve any-

The first level achieved is called the Fraternity Award, The next level is the Unity Award. The top honor, for the most active councils, is the Charity Award. As if that wasn't enough, later that same month, Bill suffered a serious stroke. He required brain surgery to stop the hemorrhage. While Bill was still undergoing the initial treatment and therapy, Anne's dad passed away on his 87th birthday.

The stress upon the family was incredible, but they reached out to God for support through these trying times. Anne frequently shared updates with our Council, providing us with news on the physical and mental progress of her husband. The Council responded with prayers and encouragement, but it was she that truly encouraged us and strengthened us with her resolute and unfailing faith in Jesus Christ. She demonstrated unwavering commitment to Bill and to her faith, not to mention to her mother who was still grieving from the loss of her own husband.

Bill and Anne moved back to Raleigh earlier this year. They both look forward to seeing their friends and fellow parishioners at St. Luke's.

He is still undergoing therapy, and please continue to keep him and Anne in our prayers. We are truly blessed to witness their devotion to each other and to God. I am proud to announce Bill and Anne Donnelly as this year's Family of the Year.


After installation, our new officers, wives and Brothers and guests ad-
