Community Programs — John Puhak

Thanks to Brother Jim Hoyle for his dedicated Community Program leadership over the last three years, and thanks to Brother John Puhak, our new Community Director.

The Student Essay Contest began October 14, with winners to be announced November 30. About 20 participants have applied to write 500-750 words on "everyday obstacles experienced while living a life of authentic faith" — emphasizing overcoming the obstacle and how this experience helped grow faith. Council will award prizes for first and second place for each grade, 8 –12.

Council purchased 72 coats for kids. Thanks to Brother Jim Hoyle 's work with CPO on distribution plan. Again his year we are partnering with other area K of C councils sponsoring a wheelchair for a needy recipient.

Council contributed \$1,000 towards the building of the Habitat for Humanity house in Wake County. Thanks to Brothers Abell, Hill, Cuffney and Kosinski for working on the site in Cary on November 6. **See** page 7.
