# **Supreme Knight Changes**

Patrick E. Kelly is our new Supreme Knight, succeeding Carl Anderson who retired at 70, the mandatory retirement age.

We have benefitted greatly from Carl's leadership, witness, and advocacy during his 20 years managing our Order. He guided the K of C as preeminent defender of life in the United States and in other countries. Carl advocated prolife policies such as the Hyde Amendment and the Mexican City Policy, recently revoked by Presidential Executive Order.

Supreme Knight Anderson established the K of C ultrasound initiative with over 1.300 ultrasound machines donated by councils throughout the US.

He was appointed to the pontifical Academy of Life by Pope

Saint John Paul II in 1998, and was reappointed by subsequent popes. He has served as a consultant to the US Conference of Catholic Bishops, and Benedict XVI appointed him to the Pontifical Council for the Family in 2008.

New Supreme Knight Patrick E. Kelly served as Deputy Supreme Knight for four years and was previously the Order's Vice President of Public Policy for 11 years. He ahs been the past state deputy of the District of Columbia.

In 2011 he oversaw the renewal of the Pope john Paul II Cultural Center and was appointed the first director of what would become the St. John Paul II National Shrine. He has chaired the Board of Directors of the National March for Life for the last several years.

Patrick served 24 years in active duty and in the reserves, US Navy JAG Corps. As judge advocate he specialized in international and operational law at the U.S. Naval War College.

Before K of C assignments he served as an advisor to the House Intelligence Committee and at the Justice Department specializing in counter terrorism and national security.

Patrick Kelly holds a Master in Theology from the Pontifical John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family in DC and a law degree from Marquette University where he joined the Knights in 1983.

He and his wife Vanessa have three daughters and live in Connecticut.

#### History and Background: St. Luke's K of C Council

K of C Council 12455 was formed May 19, 1999 by Knights of Columbus Supreme. At least 30 Knights are required to form a council and these Charter Members are listed on the next page and on the charter document posted in the Knights Room in St. Luke's downstairs educational area. Several Charter Brothers transferred from neighboring St. Francis of Assisi parish K of C Council 9709. Formation of the St. Luke's K of C was encouraged by Pastor Fr. David Brockman, (now Monsignor) as well as by Knights in Raleigh area and State K of C Officers.

At that time, St. Luke's was a relatively new parish of about 400 families. Parishioners attended mass, spiritual and educational programs and social functions in our then multi-parish facility. Fr. Shea, St. Luke the Evangelist's founding pastor, retired in the mid-90s and was succeeded by Fr. Brockman in 1994. Brother Anthony Behe, our first Grand Knight, led the Council and helped recruit new members. Brother David Ottney was our first Financial Secretary. Our formative Knights understood that the K of C does a lot of good in parishes and they wanted to have a council at St. Luke's.

From this beginning the Council actively engaged in parish efforts and community service. Knights arranged parish picnics, social events, and worked to serve parish needs. To raise funds for council and parish charitable efforts, we volunteered at Hardees, staffed beer booths at the Canes' Hockey games, ran BBQ cookouts, and other activities. We helped set up and maintain the outside grotto area and the Stations of the Cross trail. (Note the grotto walkway bricks inscribed by parish and Knight families. Brothers Dick Hoffman, Frank Sancineto Jr, and others organized parish picnics and handling food preparation, service and cleanup. Brothers Petrovick, Cox, Tomczak, and Terry Whelan, facilitated parish social events, such as St. Patrick Day parties, dances, Veterans Day recognition, seminarian support, and Sunday pancake breakfasts One of our Council activities is Adopt-a-Highway, started by GK Joe Sander in 2001. This is our twentieth year for AAH, led by Brother Abell since 2002.

Council organized yearly Lenten soup suppers, Keep Christ in Christmas sales (cards and nativity displays), and supported youth activities including burger bashes, teen education and competitions, and fund-raising activities. Brother Knights serve on the parish Pastoral and the Financial Councils.

Individually Brothers do parish spiritual growth ministries, including RCIA, choir, cantor, greeting and usher ministries, Journeymen and "That Man is You" programs, as well as participate in Church study groups and Ignatian Retreat weekends, Rosary before weekend masses, and perpetual and hourly adorations of the Blessed Sacrament.

Diocesan wide: Brothers financially support and volunteer at Catholic Parish Outreach's distribution of food and winter coats for the needy; assemble and disassemble the Diocesan Center creche (designed and built by our Brothers Cox and Corsmeier); annually facilitate the Bishop's Annual Chrism mass,

preparing and distribution of Holy Oils; join with other K of C councils raising monies for the intellectually handicapped (Operation Lamb led for last ten years by Brother Hill); participated in Right to Life and Birth Choice prayer and support activities; help run the annual Special Olympics; and, support Habitat for Humanity house construction projects.

In the early 2000s our parishioners financed and rebuilt St. Luke's separate worship, educational and office facilities. The new sanctuary accommodated about 300 and an attached hall and kitchen area made parish social events easy, popular, and delightful. The half/kitchen enabled parishioner breakfasts, lunches, dinners, receptions, dances, and other evening festivities. Events sponsored by Knights included parishioner socials, big band dances and other charity events and fundraisers.

Tragedy stuck in 2014, as vandalization and fire destroyed our relatively new sanctuary and church. The hall became our temporary church sanctuary and masses, and spiritual activities were held there, during a time of discerning future steps to repair or rebuild. Brother Rodger Ewbank designed and built the interim alter and platform, now used as stage.

We rebuilt, and in 2018 Bishop Zarama dedicated our new church and sanctuary and gathering space. Council Brothers and other parishioners helped in fundraising, architectural design, and landscaping deliberations. Brothers Kosinski and Knudson advised Pastor Fr. Robert Staley in construction financing, scheduling, and oversight matters.

The new St. Luke's church facility is a beautiful spiritual witness, a joy to parishioners, and a holy site for masses, prayer, and spiritual growth. Our Council was privileged to donate the cross above the main church entrance.

During the Pandemic 2020-2021, interaction among Brothers and our engagement in parish and community understandably was curtailed. However, we continue to meet, organize, and serve the parish with proper distancing and masking. Weather permitting, we gather outside and continue feasible and needed projects. During 2020, we designed and implemented a brand-new Council webpage, continued to publish the Council Newsletter, assisted in moving, remodeling, clean up or arranging facilities. We remain at the service of our Pastor and Council Chaplain Monsignor Jeffery Ingham.

These Knight activities are rewarding, and often are fun times with Brothers, working with parishioners and others in service to our parish, diocese, and the Raleigh community.

## Faith Program -

Several Brother Knights do Friday adoration at St. Luke's. Brothers also staff regular hours at 24-7 adoration chapels at St. Catherine's and Our Lady of Lourdes.

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament is very important but sometimes not viewed as a necessary devotion — adoration may not easily fit into our busy lives.

There is nothing better than a personal encounter with the Lord. Consider adoration of the Blessed Sacrament as a personal spiritual growth opportunity. It may be inconvenient, but if you give it a reasonable trial, you will experience His presence and, find it essential as we walk through the challenges of daily life.

Brothers and spouses also lead or pray the Rosary before weekend masses.

For over 20 years St. Luke's Council has participated in Supremes' Refund Support Vocations Program. RSVP works this way: the Council monthly contributes to individual seminarians to help with their personal expenses. Thanks to Brother Joe Jacobs for coordinating this program. We usually support three seminarians

Each \$500 in RSVP dollars we spend, entitles our Council to a Supreme \$100 reimbursement, in this way the Order fosters financial support of diocesan seminarians.

Note on page 3 of this Newsletter we listCouncil 12455 Supported Seminarians, who are now Priests.

During training for priesthood or religious life, we send monthly checks to seminarians: With Fr. Steven DiMassimo, now a priest, (see below), we now send RSVP support to seminarians Drew Navarro and Eric Reyes.

## Steven DiMassimo Ordained to Priesthood

Bishop Zarama ordained deacon and Brother Knight Steven DiMassimo to the priesthood Saturday June 5 at Holy Name Cathedral. The July-August NC Catholics magazine features the ordination and Steve's own story about his discernment of calling to priesthood.

After ordination, Fr. Steven was hosted at a Our Lady of Lourdes reception where he met friends and supporters throughout the diocese. On Sunday Fr. Steven celebrated his first public mass (11AM) at St. Luke's. He led a procession with the Holy Eucharist to and from our grotto. Council 12455 fourth degree Knights were privileged to escort Fr. Steven holding the Monstrance. See page 7.

After there was a St. Luke's reception. Scores of parishioners talked to Fr Steven and requested his prayers for their intentions. Fr. Steven had a long and full first day of priesthood. Fr. Steven is assigned to Chapel Hill St. Thomas More parish. As Parochial Vicar he is a welcome spiritual resource, available to college students. His years as a FOCUS campus minister prepared him for this ministry in the university community.

## Life Program — Jerome Savage

Raleigh's March for Life (January 16) was led by Bishop Zarama, Lieutenant Governor Mark Robinson and other prolife dignitaries, who addressed us at the Capitol.

DC's Vigil Mass for Life at the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception (January 28). Televised and relevant to the prolife cause was Archbishop Joseph Naumann's (Kansas City) sermon.

In April, we showed parishioners the movie —Rowe v. Wade — in St. Luke's parish hall. This is the story/

truth about this Supreme Court case and its unfortunate decision.

Regarding Congressional deliberations of the Equity Act bill, the U.S. Bishops believe that Equity Act proposal goes far beyond the noble desire to protect vulnerable people. It burdens consciences, severely curtails the rights of people to practice their faith, smuggles in an abortion mandate, and explicitly exempts itself from respecting religious freedom. The 40 Days for LIFE peaceful prayer vigil in one-hour increments started Sept 22 and runs through Oct 31. St. Luke's parishioners are scheduled to pray at the Drake Circle abortion
